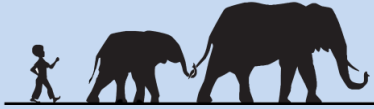

After 3 years of studying with JWOC, Chanty's students successfully completed their English course last month. A new class has replaced it and 24 young children are learning every weekday morning. Chanty now teaches with the assistance of Jacques, a long term volunteer from France. *Students are practicing naming common classroom objects in their 5<sup>th</sup> class. (left)*



Back to school saw the start of a new academic year for state schools who announced changes to the school timetable. JWOC has had to respond to this as attendance at main stream school is something we advocate.
